FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Johnson Fire Department would like to encourage residents to formulate a home fire escape plan. Sit down with everyone in your household and discuss how each person will get out of the home in a fire. It's important to practice your escape plan, to make sure everyone knows ESCAP two ways out of each room if possible, and to determine who is responsible for helping those who need it (young children, older adults, and peo-

ple with disabilities). Remember to get low and go under the smoke to the nearest exit, choose a meeting place outside, a safe distance from your home, and to never re-enter a burning building.

A note to everyone that a fire permit is required for outdoor burning. Fire permits are available at the Johnson Township office. These Permits are required to burn and are only \$10 for the calendar year. Also a reminder that day time burning is not allowed.

February 21 Council Meeting Minutes:

- Algoma Power Inc. presented an update on annual proposed work. Items discussed included Health & Safety Environment, Operations Updates and Regulatory scorecards. API is planning an open house info session for property owners regarding proposed work.
- Approval of the sale of the three portables at 5 Margaret Street by tender. Minimum bid is \$2000.00.
- Council approves the installation of three new hitching posts in the Hamlet for the Mennonite community.
- The Township supports the continuation of the arrangement with Plummer concerning Johnson Recreation's administration of the soccer, baseball and swim programs for both townships in return for administrative and program fees
- Council approves the submission of a joint application with neighbouring municipalities through the Community Transportation Grant Program, as transportation services to medical appointments/services has been identified as one of the common needs along the North Shore.
