SENIOR COMPUTER PROGRAM UPDATE - Johnson Township Recreation and the 50+ Club recently finished up a 6- week course in the use of iPads and iPhones as part of a program funded by the Ontario Ministry of Senior Affairs. Much thanks goes to the Adult Learning Centre for providing the instructor Krista Kerr who ran a great and accessible course. This is the second installment of the Johnson Township Seniors Computer Program, the first occurring in the spring. **There will be a 3rd and final 6-week course occurring in the new year, Wednesdays 10am, from January 30 to the beginning of March.** This course will focus on Android devices. There are a few Township android Tablets for use during this course, purchased through the Senior Affairs funding. HEALTHY KIDS COMMUNITY CHALLENGE (HKCC) WRAP-UP - The 3-year HKCC North Channel project wrapped up in September of this year. Johnson Township was one of 11 area municipalities and First Nations communities acting on the Steering Committee on this project, overlooking \$825,000 from the Ontario Ministry of Health for programs and services to boost healthy living and eating choices for kids and their families. It was a great example of inter-municipal cooperation!

Aside from cross-North Channel and in-school media campaigns, events, contests, and programs (including Drink Water Poster and Reduce Screen Time contests, a Scavenger Hunt, and an Obstacle Course Race among others) the program provided specific value to Johnson Township including: new equipment for its programs, i.e., bats, balls, soccer balls, soccer nets, hockey nets; a water bottle fountain at the arena that has been used thousands of times; tons of paid ice time for free skating at the JTCC arena over 3 years; new dugouts at the ballfield; new playground equipment, garden boxes, and greenhouse support at CASS elementary; several food preparation and food awareness programs for local kids, including a successful smoothie and fruit and vegetable program at the Canteen and township events; canning equipment and new food processors for the JTCC kitchen; a Family Wellness Night, a kids apple sauce preparation workshop, and a Come Learn Ringette day; a Natural Playground design by one of the world's leading natural playground design companies for the knoll at the soccer fields and a slide for the future design site; financial support for a Family Good Food Box program; voucher program for families to visit area vegetable and fruit producers/retailers and purchase product samples; and that's what we can remember!! Much thanks goes to Tina Johncox and the Algoma District Services Administrative Board for TONS of hard work and time administering this excellent program. We hope that all area families enjoyed the programs and learnt more about healthy and active living.

Tips to protect you and your family during the holidays:

- Never leave the kitchen when cooking on the stove, and if you must leave, turn off the stove. If a pot catches fire, do not try to move it. Cover the pot with a lid to smother the flames and turn of the burner.
- Keep things that can burn such as cooking utensils and paper towels a safe distance from the stove.
- Keep an eye on any drinkers in your household and make sure all cigarettes are properly extinguished and the stove is off before going to bed.
- Extinguish cigarettes in large, deep ashtrays and empty in a metal container - not the garbage can and put outside.
- Cigarettes can smoulder among upholstered items

for hours before igniting. Check sofas and chairs for cigarettes that may have fallen between the cushions.

- Drink responsibly. Excessive alcohol consumption is a contributing factor in many residential fires.
- Install and maintain working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms outside all sleeping areas of the home. Smoke alarms also are required on every storey. Failure to comply with the smoke and carbon monoxide alarm requirements can result in a ticket for \$360 or a fine of up to \$50,000 for individuals and \$100,000 for corporations.
- Develop and practice a home escape plan with everyone in the home.
