There are questions that we often hear from residents, and so we thought we'd try our best to answer them

Why can't I burn during the day?

• Several factors here. As we have a Volunteer Fire Choose a safe site - Piles must be at least 2m from Dept., many of our firefighters are at work and if any other flammable materials. there is a fire, we have less manpower. Also, winds Stay with your fire - If you start a fire outdoors, tend to be higher during the day. Every year we have people start fires that get out of hand and you must take all necessary steps to tend the fire, require the FD-EVERY YEAR. This is costly to our keep it under control, and extinguish it before volunteer resources and to you the taxpayer. leaving the site.

Why do I have to phone in that I am burning?

- For the simple reason that then we know where there is burning going on, so when someone calls in that they see smoke we don't have to call volun-
- teers in and send them out on a wild goose chase—again a cost to our volunteer resources and to your tax money. If someone calls in a report we are legally obliged to attend that call. The less false alarms, the more we save on using up our human and tax resources.
- Burn permits for the township can be purchased at the township office for **\$10.00**, and they are good until December 31, 2019.
- Prior to burning the permit holder, or designate, shall call 705-782-6802 and leave a message containing the following information:
- 1. Name 2. Civic Address 3. Permit Number 4. Date & Time of intended fire

- ** A reminder that there is a daytime burning restric- Choose a safe time Any fire is more likely to get out of control on a hot, dry or windy day. Burn two hours before sunset or later, and ensure that they are out two hours after sunrise.
 - Keep your fire small Keep your pile of wood, brush, or debris less than 2m in diameter and less than 2m high.
