MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR:

Currently our landfill is receiving high grades from regulators on our innovative ways to keep material out of the landfill cell. Our "Share Shed" does an excellent job at giving residents an opportunity to give new ownership to all kinds of no-longer wanted household items like clothes, ceramics, books, furniture etc. Our metal pile allows us to realize the scrap value of metal that would otherwise take up space in the landfill. I also see residents taking great care and time to separate glass beverage containers that have deposit value into separate bins. These two actions alone provide small amounts of revenue for landfill operations and do an excellent job of extending the life of our land fill site. Overall we should be proud that the collective efforts of our landfill staff and residents have given us a "best in class" landfill facility that stands out from other municipalities.
