COOKING - is the leading cause of fires during the holidays. Always stay in the Kitchen while cooking

HEATING EQUIPMENT is the second leading cause of fires during the holidays. Heating systems and chimneys should be inspected and cleaned annually by a qualified service technician.

SMOKING is the leading cause of fatal fires during the holidays. Butt-out cigarettes in large, deep ashtrays.

ALCOHOL is a factor in approximately one in five fatal fires during the holidays. Drink responsibly during the holiday season. FIRE MOVES FASTER THAN YOU

You Need To Be Responsible For Your Family's Fire Safety!

Install smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas. - IT IS THE LAW! Test them every month.

Develop and practice a home fire escape plan so that everyone knows what to do if a fire occurs.

Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery, and clothing

Ensure that vehicles are not left running inside any garage or building.

Residents on Township Water-If you plan to leave your Day, Christmas Day, Easter Monday, Remembrance home for the winter, please ensure your waterlines are properly winterized and to notify the town-ship office.

Winter Parking-Please remember that from now through to April 2021 there is no overnight parking allowed on Township Roads. This By-Law is in effect, snow or no snow.

911 Signs-A reminder that 911 Civic Number Signs should be upright, clear and visible from/or at your driveway.

Landfill- A reminder that the landfill is closed when a statutory or non-statutory holiday falls on a regular operating day. These Holidays may include: Labour Day, New Year's Day, Victoria Day, Thanksgiving Day, Canada

Day, Good Friday, and Civic Holidays.

NEWS FROM COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Highlights from the minutes of the October 21 and November 18 Council Meetings. Please note that this report does not include all proceedings of the council meetings. For more detailed information, please request copies of the minutes at the Township Office.

Council approves:

- the purchase of a new Accounting Software, Sage 50 for approximately \$1,000.00 and a new tax and utility program from The Managed Municipality for approximately \$9,000.00
- the issuing of the Request for Proposals Facility Condition Assessment for Four Municipally-owned buildings
- entering into discussions about a joint shared service with Tarbutt Township for the construction, maintenance and operation of a Sand Shed.
- supporting the resolution from Tarbutt Township with regard to more support for the agriculture industry in Northern Ontario
- the lowering of the speed limit to 60km per hr for a

portion of Gordon Lake Road

the purchase of a 2021 John Deere 190GW Wheeled Excavator FT4 to support the 10-year Roads development, maintenance, and ditching plan being developed by Public Works.

Council has also adopted a Strategic plan and will be posting it on the website soon. Residents are asked to participate in the strategic plan by letting councilors know what they would like to see - think of it as a wish list so we can plan into the future!

Staff has applied for \$100K in Covid Resilience grant money for improvements to the municipal office and \$60K in grant money bring the Township into compliance with Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act

Council would like to extend a sincere thank you to all Township staff and volunteers for their hard work and effort during this difficult year.

Public Works has begun preparing 10-year road development & maintenance and ditching plans for the township.

PW wants you to know that all snow removal equipment has been serviced and sand is delivered—we are ready for winter. Please have patience when there is a snow storm, we have limited resources and over 90kms of roads to attend to, 2 machines, and 3 operators.
