Road conditions can be seriously affected by the kind of weather that occurs at this time of year, especially as it is alternating freezing rain, snow, and melting. Snow plowing and sanding is ongoing. Call us at 782 6601 x1206, if you discover a particular problem area, this line is monitored or you will be directed to call an emergency number. And please Drive Carefully and give yourself lots of time when the weather is bad.

PLEASE! NO TRANSFERRING SNOW ACROSS A TOWN-SHIP ROAD FROM YOUR DRIVEWAY!!

IT CAN CREATE ALL KINDS OF PROBLEMS! CLUMPS OF SNOW IN THE ROADWAY CAN CAUSE A DRIVING HAZARD AND DAMAGE VEHICLES AND SNOW REMOVAL EQUIP-MENT:

- Snow piled on the side of the road can cause serious damage to the snow **removal equipment**, particularly the plow wing of both the grader and the plowtruck when the Public Works crew is levelling the banks to accommodate snow from new storms.
- Snow piled up on ditches can lead to drainage problems in the spring with possible flooding issues when it melts.

Ontario Highway Traffic Act—Section 181 states: No person shall **deposit snow** or ice on a **roadway** without permission in writing so to do from the Ministry or the road authority responsible for the maintenance of the road

Shoulder and ditches are part of the roadway. Letters will be sent out to property owners who insist on pushing snow across the road. The OPP has confirmed that they will lay charges on those who insist on continuing this practice. PLEASE DON'T DO IT!
