The Public Works Garage

The Public works team has been out busy as beavers preparing one of the Lagoon's to be cleaned. This longawaited job started October 1st and is going swimmingly. The team was able to use materials and equipment the Township already had on hand, saving over \$100,000 on the project. Culvert replacement is still ongoing throughout the Township and will continue until winter starts to set in. Things are about to get a little brighter! Through a fundingassisted program, all the exterior lighting and street lights in the Township are going to be upgraded to LED lighting. Providing significant savings on hydro expenses, the upgrade cost is expected to be recouped within 5 years of installation.



FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS



September 23rd 2021

Council adopted the site plan for the severance of the property on Margaret Street (school property). Once severed this portion of the property will be used to create a housing development and the remaining portion will see the development of the Natural Playground and recreation space for the community.

Council passed a new By-Law, By-Law 2021-1006, in regards to Covid-19 vaccinations for employees, volunteers, workers, council, contractors, and sub-contractors. All the above-mentioned must be double vaccinated by November 1, 2021, and provide a Proof of Vaccination Passport. Council supported the NOHFC funding application for repairs to the Johnson Township Community Centre. The application has since moved into stage two with the potential for a \$250,000 grant for Arena improvements. Council also authorized staff to complete an application to The Trillium Foundation for a grant of \$500,000 for arena repairs and improvements. This application has since been submitted and we are optimistic about the result of both grant applications.

Your fire service challenges you to...



Test your smoke alarms every month. **#GetLoud**

Notes from the Fire Chief October 3 - 9 2021 was Fire Prevention Week

Cheif Smith has issued a challenge to everyone in Johnson Township to test their smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and "#GetLoud!" as part of Fire Prevention Week. Fire Prevention Week ran from October 3-9 and the Johnson Township Volunteer Fire Department is urging everyone to #GetLoud! and "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety™".

By law, every home in Ontario must have a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas however, too often fatal fires in Ontario occur in homes where there were no working smoke alarms. Do you know what your smoke alarm is telling you with those beeps? Chief Smith is challenging you to "Get Loud!" and push the test button on smoke and carbon monoxide alarms every month to learn the sound alarms make.

Testing alarms produce a BEEP, the sound of alarms in an emergency. Replace the batteries if the alarms do not sound when the test button is pushed. If the alarms still don't sound, replace the alarms.

Testing your alarms is the only way to ensure they are working and that you and your family can be alerted in the event of a fire.

"Knowing the different sounds your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms make can save you, your loved ones, and your home. A "BEEP" indicates an emergency and you need to get everyone out of the house. A "CHIRP" means the batteries need to be replaced. We Challenge you to take the easiest test you will ever do and #GetLoud! by testing your alarms every month to learn the sound they make and to ensure the batteries are in working order."
