The Racks Rolled In at the 14th Annual Big Buck Contest







Hunter's from throughout Algoma gathered under the Pavilion at the Johnson Township Community Centre on Sunday, November 14th, 2021 to see if their buck measured up.

15 hunters were successful in securing their bucks this year, but Greg Ford was the luckiest. Greg won this year's contest with a 10 point buck scoring 151.70 points. Greg took home the grand prize of \$300 cash for his successful hunt.

Keith MacKay came in second, with a 10 point buck scoring 145.40 points and taking home \$150 cash. Lucky Defend won third with an 8 point buck scoring 144.10 points and taking home \$75 in cash. Nelson MacKay was this year's youth (21 and under), winner, with a 10 point buck scoring 91.20 and taking home \$50 in cash. Each of the 58 registered hunters went home with a locally donated prize thanks to the many generous sponsors from within our community. Prizes this year included a Rifle Scope generously donated by Hunters Headquarters, a Compound Bow donated by Tunnel Lake Trading Post, and many other great prizes from area businesses. FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS NOVEMBER 17th 2021

Council saw the first draft of the boundary road agreement for Puddingstone Road between Johnson and Tarbutt. The draft by-law comes into effect to discuss the maintenance and repair of Puddingstone Road, which was developed almost right on the municipality lines. The agreement states that Johnson Township shall perform and coordinate all general maintenance for Puddingstone Road. However, each municipality will be responsible for maintaining its side of the road. Cost for maintence will be shared 50/50 by the two municipalities. Township office renovations are now underway. The first stage of renovations will open up the current office space to provide an open concept space for the council chambers. The renovations will also address the health and safety concerns with the aging HVAC system and add additional office space in the springtime. Along with the removal of the portable directly in front of the Township office to make the office more easily accessible..

Notes from the Fire Chief

Enjoy a fire-safe holiday season by following these tips:

- Always stay in the kitchen when something is cooking on the stove;
- Place lit candles away from anything that can burn and out of the reach of children and pets where they can't be knocked over. Remember to snuff out candles before leaving the room or going to bed. Consider using battery-operated or electric flameless candles;
- Drink responsibly. Attempting to cook or smoke while under the influence of alcohol is too often a contributing factor in fatal fires;
- Make sure the base of real Christmas trees are immersed in water at all times, to prevent them from getting too dry;
- Check all sets of decorative lights before putting them up and discard any sets that are damaged;
