Crews are out on Gordon Lake Road doing Brush clearing. Please watch for signs of workers present and drive with caution around machinery.

Interium Tax Bills

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

February 16 2022

The February Council meeting was jammed packed with information. Starting with the introduction of the new recycling program at the Johnson Tarbutt Joint Landfill. Although thrilled to have the new bins in place council issued some concern for the care and treatment of the Landfill and Landfill staff. If community members cannot learn to follow the rules (such as Clear Garbage Bags and placing your recycling at the back of the bins) and treat landfill staff with respect then action will be taken. Which will incur costs that will be covered by taxpayer dollars. In speaking about road work to be completed on Diamond Lake Road, council raised concerns about the condition of the Diamond Lake Boat Launch. With other area boat launches closing down or no longer being accessible. The Diamond Lake Boat Launch becomes the only launch for Diamond Lake, Cloudy Lake, and McCarrel Lake. Creating a huge increase in public use.

A plan was put in place to start exploring how improvements can be made to the launch and the green space around the launch, with a report to go back to council in the coming months.
