Johnson Township Scores BIG with an assist from the Ontario Trillium Foundation



The Johnson Township Community Centre scored big with a \$500,000 Community Building Fund grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. On Friday, April 8, 2022, Johnson Township unveiled the plans for how this grant, which is focused on capital projects, is being used to help with repairs and renovations that will extend the life of the facility. Construction will begin in May and is expected to wrap up in March 2023.

Originally built in 1978, the Johnson Township Community Centre has been a vital part of the area's recreational activities. The Community Building Fund grant will be put to work to help with a number of upgrades including, replacing the exterior siding and insulation throughout the site to improve energy efficiency. Work inside the building will include improving the heating in all the dressing rooms, installing new rubber flooring, increasing accessibility by adding new handrails and reducing tripping hazards, doing some repairs to the concrete, including the ice pad and the Zamboni room, and finally, repairing the north-west corner of the Community Centre. Repairs and renovations to the Centre will have a large impact on creating a facility that is safe, accessible, and positioned to handle the demands of not only Johnson Township but 11 additional municipalities that use the space as well. The renovations will position Johnson Township Community Centre to be prepared to bid on larger sporting events or activities, that will add valuable tourism dollars to the local economy.

The Public Works Garage

Many of the Public Works Spring & Summer projects have started throughout the Township. You may have noticed the drainage work around the Ball Diamond and Tennis Courts at the Community Centre. This is part of the funding received to help with upgrades of the Community Centre.

Half load will be off in the coming weeks and work is underway ditching along Government Road between Lake Huron Drive and Gordon Lake Road. Expect delays along this section of road and avoid if at all possible.

The resurfacing of Lake Huron Drive is approved and will begin after the May long weekend with expected completion by the end of June. You can expect delays and detours while work is completed. If you can avoid this area during construction it would be appreciated. Dust control will begin in the coming weeks with calcium being deposited along our gravel roadways.

Our workers appreciated your patience and understanding as we make some major improvements this summer throughout the Township.

Wednesday, May 18th 2022 5:30pm Via Zoom: reach out if you need the link to attend At the April meeting, the Clerk presented a request to council to rejuvenate and resurface Lake Huron Drive. Since the road was paved in 1973 it has never been resurfaced and repairs just aren't cutting it anymore. The proposal includes work to repair or replace the sidewalk and curb, repair catch basins, provide wheelchair ramps to access sidewalks, and repave the roadway. \$70,000 per year for the next 5 years will be granted to the Township through a program from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation and a large portion of these funds could be allocated towards the Lake Huron Drive project.

Notes from the Fire Chief

Safety is Key When Burning Grass and Debris

With the summer weather approaching, we would like to remind you that now is the time to apply for your burning permit. There is no cost to acquire your permit and it can be done easily online at www.johnsontownship.ca/services/fire-department or in person at the Township office. When you do choose to burn please remember:

- **No Daytime Burning:** Please start your fire 2 hours before sunset and extinguish your fire 2 hours after sunrise.
- Call in Your Fire: Before you start to burn please phone it in at 705-782-6802.
- Keep it Small: Your burn pile must be no larger than 6feet high by 6feet wide.
- Watch the Wind: Make sure to burn on a calm day and always stay with your fire.

You are responsible and liable for damages caused by a fire you started so please burn responsibly. Our area is currently rated at High Risk for Forest Fires, we do not have a fire burn in place at this time, but please continue to check for updates at the Fire Hall or on the Johnson Township website.
