The 2022 budget has been passed with a zero tax increase for 2022. This was possible due to careful planning and aggressive application for Grants. With unspent funds from 2021, the Johnson Township Fire Department is planning some exciting improvements including upgrading the fire bunker, upgrades to various radio equipment, and the purchase of a drone. The Joint Landfill Meeting occured on June 1, 2022 to discuss ongoing efforts to run the Johnson & Tarbutt Joint Landfill Site. Many options are being discussed to help improve operations and cut costs at our local landfill. Any changes made regarding where to dispose of different types of waste will be communicated through the Landfill Site Staff.

Notes from the Fire Chief





If you haven't already, now is the time to apply for your burning permit. There is <u>no cost</u> to acquire your permit and it can be done easily online at <u>www.johnsontownship.ca/services/fire-department</u> or in person at the Township office.

Want to burn? Follow these steps!

- Check with the Johnson Township Fire Department to determine whether open-air burning is permitted by calling 705-782-6802.
- Fires should be built on bare soil or exposed rock.
- Remove leaves and twigs from around the fire to keep it from spreading.
- Always keep a bucket of water, sand or even a shovel close by.
- Supervise the fire at all times.
