



Annual ATV Poker Run







The Public Works Garage

The team has been busy out on Diamond Lake Road replacing culverts and making some changes to the snowplow turnaround preparing for the winter weather. The majority of the 2022 Roads Work Plan has been completed with the remaining ditching, and culvert replacements ongoing as long as weather permits. The Public Works Team had a very successful year completing many major projects throughout the township plus a few extra projects to deal with drainage at the arena and rehabilitation of the school property.

GENERATORS

- NEVER use a generator in an enclosed space, like a garage or porch, even with the door open.

September 21, 2022

Council approved the hiring of a second fulltime position at the Johnson Township Community Centre. Rob Romberg was the successful applicant for the position and has started work at the arena helping to prepare for this year's ice season.

Council accepted the quote from Tulloch
Engineering to explore additional options of cell

Council accepted the requirements of the Canada Active Transportation Fund Agreement that will award the township \$50,000 to complete a master plan for Active Transportation. This will include looking at green space for hiking, biking, walking, and riding without the use of motorized vehicles. This plan will position the township to apply for future grants to develop the trails, walking and biking paths, sidewalks, and safe highway overpasses.
