This is the scene that greeted Recreation Staff and Volunteers at the Family Day, Fun Day Winter Carnival. Volunteers were ready and waiting at the top of the burn slides to welcome children young and old to race down the large snowy mountain. While others took part in classic favourites like the 2x4 Family Ski Races or Log Sawing and Nail Driving provided by Hugh Hunter and his grandson. Or you could find families running through the woods testing their skills on the obstacle course. By 1:30pm the bulk of families could be found gathered around the large hay pit encouraging their children to find the "Money in the Hay". As Loonies, Toonies, and Quarters were tossed into the hay and each designated age group had only minutes to find what they could. By the end, even the parents had a go to see what they could find. Taking their winnings indoors families were found enjoying a hot chocolate and watching the Skate Show hosted by The Shamrock Figure Skating Club. As the show ended families went upstairs to wait their turn at Face Painting provided by Melissa from the Bruce Mines Public Library and volunteer Riley Scourse. Back outdoors to sit around the campfire and roast marshmallows. With the rest heading out onto the ice for a Free Skate. As the day came to an end children picked out a prize for completing the various activities, thanks to many generous donations from McClelland's Hardware, roasted one more marshmallow and packed up to head home.

We want to thank everyone who came out and supported this funfilled day, we had over 300 people attend this annual event. We hope you had as much fun as we did. Through donations, \$80 was donated to the Bruce Mines Public Library and over \$300 was raised for local Recreational Programming.

# FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

#### **February 15 2023**

#### **Staff Reports:**

The Clerks report covered details about the sediment in the lagoons, interim tax billing, and Emergency planning.

Recreation delivered a report covering details about ongoing programming, booking highlights of the month, upcoming events, marketing updates, Proposals in the works, Grants applied for, current initiatives, and additional updates.

The Treasury department delivered a report covering status of audit, status of year end reconciliations, 2023 budget, and recieveables. Full copies of each report are available in the Council Meeting Agenda of February 15, 2023 and can be found on the Johnson Township website.

Council discussed the Water Meter By-Law adding that no person, except authorized by the Township is allowed to tamper with any water meter pipes or valves. Increasing the tampering fee to a minimum \$400.00 penalty. If you need a disconnection/reconnection of your water service please call the Township 48hrs in-advance. A \$50 fee will be charged for each disconnection/reconnection.

Council discussed the use of funding provided by OCIF in the amount of \$115,000.00. Based on the Eligible project categories, Council decided to allocate the funds to Capital projects and maintenance with a focus on Roads projects.

# **Notes from the Fire Chief**

**Donation of Surplus Gear to Fight Fire in Ukraine War** 



Inspired by the Timmins Fire Department, who collected surplus fire equipment for the Edmonton-based organization Firefighter Aid Ukraine, Volunteer Fire Departments in Echo Bay, the Township of Tarbutt, Prince Township, Wawa, Garden River First Nations and Johnson Township banned together to collect well over \$200,000 in surplus gear to send to Ukraine. Provincial guidelines state that firefighting equipment must

be replaced every 10 years. This leaves many houses with extra equipment, still in good condition, that they can not use. The Firefighter Aid Ukraine initiative was deemed to be the perfect fit for the outdated gear. At the base of these volunteer firefighters is a strong sense of community and volunteerism. The team at the Johnson Township Volunteer Fire Department saw this as an extension of what they do here for this community and jumped at the chance to help. 69 sets of bunker gear, 48 helmets, 18 pairs of boots, 50 sets of gloves, 9 harnesses, 1 medical chair, and a variety of medical supplies were sent in 4 large reinforced totes supplied by Pioneer Construction to front-line workers in Ukraine who need it most.


