Notes from the Fire Chief Conditions are Dry

As we all return to camp take a minute to check that your camp fire alarm batteries are still working and that you



have a Smoke & Carbone Monoxide (CO) alarm in ALL sleeping areas. Fire Permits are required for all outside burning in Johnson Township and can be obtained online. Remember you MUST call in when you plan to burn. Even with some of the recent rain showers, conditions in many of the forested areas remain dry. Please use caution when open-air burning for campfires or brush.

The Public Works Garage

Road Crews are working on culvert replacements throughout the township. Please be aware of workings and yield signs. **Government Road west** of Fisher Road will be closed on Wednesday August 23, 2023 and again on Wednesday August 30, 2023 east of Fisher Road. There will be a road closure on Highway 638, east of Cottage Road with no thru traffic permitted on August 21 at 8am - August 25 at 7pm. Detour signs are in place to navigate around the closure. FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS Special Meeting June 7 2023

Council was presented and passed the 2023 budget. Some major road improvement projects, upgrades to Fire equipment, and new recreational programming were all included as projects for the 2023 calendar year. Resulting in a slight increase in the tax level for 2023.

Tax Bills are Due in 2 installments with 50% Due August 30th and the remaining 50% due on October 30 2023.

June 21 2023

Council received a presentation from Brian Maki the Fire Protection Officer in regards to the new provincial licensing that all Fire Stations and Firefighters must complete the continue to provide Fire Rescue Services. Chief Ron Smith has been working diligently with the Volunteer Fire Department in preparation for this new training and certifications.

Staff from Public Works, Treasurer, and Recreation all presented monthly reports to council on projects completed and in the works. Council received the final review of the Procurement of Goods and Services ByLaw. Completing the third reading and passing the Policy for Township staff to abide by. Council received the revised By-LAw for changes to the Building Permit & Fee By-Law. The By-LAw was brought up for revision to increase the Fee's associated with building permit application within the township.

Council Received and passed the By-Law appointing the Clerk/CAO to Solemnize Civil Marriage Ceremonies.

Special Meeting June 28 2023

On June 21st 2023 Council accepted with regret the resignation of recently elected Councillor Dalton MacFarlane. Council discussed the options for filling a vacancy available to them. Which included holding a by-election, requesting letters of interest from the public, or go to the next candidate from the recent municipal election. Council determined the best course of action was to offer the recently vacant position to Gavin Grant, previous council member and candidate in the recent municipal election. Gavin Grant accepted the request of council to fill the vacant position and will start his term at the July 19

meeting. We welcome Gavin Grant to council to continue the work he was part of in the previous term.

July 19 2023

Algoma Power Inc. presented the Community Delegation report to Council. Outlining currenting planning and upcoming work to be completed in the area in coming years. Council reviewed and discussed Zoning Amendments and various applications with community members at the meeting. Highlighting discussions about the importance of wildlife habitats surrounding some of the area waterways.


