Notes from the Fire Chief Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week Nov 1 - 7th



Carbon Monoxide can be one of the deadliest things in your home. Do you know how to keep your home safe from Carbon Monoxide and what to do if your alarms go off?

Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide poisoning include headaches, dizziness, vomiting, and short-ness of breath without a fever. If your alarm sounds or you are experiencing symptom's leave the home right away and call 9-1-1. Remember to test your alarms monthly.

Did You Know: A new law was passed that drivers must not overtake snow plows working in echelon formation on multi-lane roads or highways with a posted speed limit of 80km/h or more. Passing is only permitted if a full lane is available to complete the pass safely.

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

October 25, 2023

Staff and Council members have recently undergone a variety of Emergency Management training courses offered in Sault Ste. Marie. To complete the training staff will be attending a walkthrough of an Emergency Scenario at the Johnson Township Community Centre to improve emergency response in the Township.

The Council was presented with the Johnson Township Climate Change Policy. The Policy will help to create a framework to support climate-adapted decisions and be better prepared to make decision with the increased uncertainty of a changing climate. The completed plan can be found on the website.

David MacDonald has resigned as the Community Emergency Management Coordinator for the township and Ed Sadowski was resigned as the alternate. Clerk/CAO Janet Maguire will become the new CEMC and has started the training process. David MacDonald has agreed to stay on as the alternate.

Council supported the Motion from Cambridge in regards to the Highway Traffic Act Amendments. The amendment would allow Municipal Government to install Automated Speed Enforcement Systems on any roadway in the Municipality and not just in the current Community and School Safety Zones.


