Notes from the Fire Chief



Work with your neighbours in any overlapping priority zones!

Protect Your Home from Wildfires:

Zone 0 (0–1.5 m): Keep this area non-combustible. No firewood or flammable items next to your home.

Zone 1 (1.5–10 m): Use fire-resistant plants. Space trees apart, trim lower branches, and keep grass short.

Zone 2 (10–30 m): Thin trees, prune branches, and clear dry debris.

Regular Council Meeting June 18, 2025: Council received a delegation from a local business owner on the topic of Economic Development. The delegation provided ideas to improve Economic Development in the Hamlet and the Township of Johnson. Starting with the creation of an Economic Development Plan and an Economic Development Committee. Council agreed to address the concerns and is scheduling future meetings to form an ED Committee.

Council was presented with an alternative plan for the Margaret Street Property to help alleviate Parking lot issues at the Community Centre. The report was accepted for consideration.

Council reviewed the By-Laws for Water and Sewer to discuss the increase in rates and determine the new fee structure.

Regular Council Meeting July 22, 2025: Council reviewed the Margaret Street Property alternative plan and determined not to allocate the property to recreational purposes at this time. Exploring other options for parking lot expansion with the current Property instead.

Council reviewed the By-Law to set the fees for Gordon Lake Cemetery and Desbarats Cemetery for the 2nd time.

Council discussed an increase in the Tipping Fees at the Landfill and how tipping fees would be paid. Council discussed issues with long-term permanent trailer parking that went against local zoning bylaws.

Council agreed to the request for support to the Matthews Memorial 2025 Golf Tournament by providing a gift certificate for 1 hour of ice time to use in the 2025-2026 season.

Echo Bay to St. Joseph Community Tree Giveaway

Algoma Power Inc. and the townships of MacDonald, Meredith and Aberdeen Additional, Tarbutt! Laird, Johnson and St. Joseph are holding a free distribution of trees and a native/pollinator plant seed mix giveaway to residents. Increased tree canopy cover in our communities will provide environmental and aesthetic benefits. A limited number of trees are available (150 trees total, 30 per township). Tree recipients will be chosen through a random draw. In order to receive a free tree, residents must meet the following criteria:

- There is a limit of one free tree per household
- You must be a resident of one of the townships
- The tree must be planted on your property

Residents are responsible for planting, watering and maintaining the tree. Register by completing this form (https://forms.gle/Rkx7xVgpZ6UYbjUNA) by the deadline date of Wednesday, September 24, 2025. Those that are successful in the random tree draw will receive an email prior to tree pickup day on Saturday, October 4, 2025 from 10 am to 2 pm at the Johnson Township Farmers Market in Desbarats. Anyone coming to the tree pickup day will receive a free package of native/pollinator plant seeds.
