


18th Annual Big Buck Contest

Completing a large portion of the summer upgrades for 2025, the Banquet Hall and Kitchen are now fully equipped with Air Conditioning, thanks to a grant from NOHFC, to make all your bookings and events more enjoyable.

The Multi-Sport Court containment fence is scheduled for installation on Monday, September 15^{th,} 2025. The court will be closed for use while the fence installation is ongoing. To protect the equipment the hand crank for the net has been removed. Stop in and ask JTCC staff for assistance if you want to see the net height changed or for additional Pickleball nets. Someone is on site Mon-Sat 8am-5pm. A large bin has been added to the court to house various sports equipment available for public use. 

Notes from the Fire Chief

Charge into Safety



As we prepare to go back to school, have you talked to your children about safe charging of devices? Most rechargeable electronic items they will use for school, cellphones, laptops, headphones etc. are powered by Lithium-Ion batteries. When used incorrectly, these batteries can cause a fire or explosion risk to your home. Talk to your students about:

- Buying stamped and tested products with a Canadian certification marking e.g., CSA, cUL, cETL. This includes charging blocks and devices.
- Charging your devices safely, on a hard surface with the provided undamaged cord and don't overcharge devices.
- Properly dispose of broken or damaged products not in your household trash.

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

August, 20, 2025

Regular Council Meeting August 20, 2025: Council received staff reports with regard to:

- Final tax bills have been issued and are due August 30th and October 30, 2025.
- Overview of the 2012 Chevy Half Ton with regard to the work needed for repairing the vehicle.
 Council approved the decision to source out various quotes on the cost to complete the work and later evaluate if the cost is feasible.
- Facility Rental Rates review for October 1 2025 September 30, 2026. Council decided on a slight increase in ice rental rates and to combine Hall rentals with Kitchen rentals and provide additional setup time before and after an 8hr rental.
- Council approved the Request for Quotation document regarding the Active Transportation Plan to be developed for Johnson Township, thanks to funding provided from the Active Transportation Fund.
- Council was provided a proposal to authorize staff to prepare and complete a grant application to FedNor to have an Economic Development Plan completed. With limited staff in 2026, the council has decided to revisit this proposal at a later date.
- Council will support the creation of an Economic Development Committee to help guide the next steps
 of Economic Development in Johnson Township. The first meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October
 2, 2025 at 7pm at the Johnson Township Community Centre Banquet Hall. Anyone interested in
 Economic Development is encouraged to attend. An agenda will be provided closer to the day.

The Council accepted the increase in tipping fees for the Johnson/Tarbutt Landfill. See below for the <u>updated fee schedule and when it will come into effect.</u>

The Council supports the Resolution presented by the City of North Bay to make the Northern Ontario Resource Development Support (NORDS) program a permanent fixture and to expand the supports to include the impact of agricultural equipment on municipal infrastructure.




