Notes from the Fire Chief Fire Prevention Week Oct 5 - 11



"Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home" is a 3-step process to protect your home and your family from the danger of Lithium-Ion batteries. With so many products now relying on Lithium-Ion batteries, it is important to understand how to BUY, CHARGE, AND RECYCLE these batteries safely. With so much energy stored in such tiny places, these batteries can overheat, start a fire, or explode if not handled properly. Remember to:

- BUY: Only buy products with a safety certification, such as UL, ETL, or CSA, meaning they meet important safety standards.
- CHARGE: Always use the cables that came with the products to charge, or purchase new chargers approved by the manufacturer. Always charge your devices on a hard surface and DON'T OVERCHARGE the device.
- RECYCLE: Don't put lithium-ion batteries in the garbage or recycling bins. Visit call2recycle.org to find out how and where to safely recycle batteries. Local locations include:

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

September, 17, 2025

Regular Council Meeting

Council received a delegation presentation from Robert Peace for RockNetwork with an update regarding the Fibre Optic internet project. Approximately 450 homes in Johnson Township will be eligible for the fibre optic infrastructure installation. A Public meeting will be held on Thursday, October 23, for community members to learn more, hear about internet service options and sign up for the installation of fibre optic cable to their homes.

Council accepted the reports presented by staff. The report presented by the Fire Chief highlighted the cost of the newly imposed firefighter training at \$6000-\$7000 per firefighter. Indicating that consideration be taken for compensation, time off work, travel and accommodations required to take these mandatory courses. As the deadline for certification requirements comes closer, various Municipalities are seeking support to extend and review these mandatory firefighter certification requirements, including Johnson Township.

Council revisited the staffing concerns during bookings at the Johnson Township Community Centre. After receiving an update from the Insurance Company in regards to necessary measures for Public Buildings, the council asked staff to prepare recommendations for the next meeting in regards to staffing needs during various booking situations.

Algoma Public Health urges residents to get vaccinated against respiratory illnesses this fall

Algoma Public Health (APH) is encouraging all residents to protect themselves and their loved ones this fall by getting vaccinated against flu, COVID-19 and Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV).

This fall, Ontario has expanded RSV protection:

- Adults aged 75 and older are now eligible for the RSV vaccine.
- Infants under eight months and high-risk children up to 24 months can receive Beyfortus®, a monoclonal antibody.
- Pregnant individuals may receive Abrysvo®, which helps protect infants at birth.
