It will be similar to a recorded vote however I will not record how each of you voted unless a Recorded Vote is specifically requested.


### Subject: NOHFC appeal

As I mentioned I did launch an appeal with NOHFC to reconsider our application for funding to rehabilitate the Lagoons. I have also included MPP Romano in our correspondence and have been in communication with him to review our application. He has been in contact with NOHFC to discuss and I anticipate a response any day from them.

### Subject: Lagoon prep for rehabilitating

As council requested I have been looking into any available options for addressing the capacity issue with the Lagoons. Mean time we have done some minor long overdue maintenance on the access road to the Lagoons. We have brought in several loads of rock to get us out of the water and able to drive up onto the access road. Terry has done some additional maintenance on the access road its self. We are looking into whether or not we need to expand the turnaround area out at the Lagoons. These are minor issues but necessary and long overdue.




Johnson Township Owned Parcels Margaret St & Main St, Desbarats, ON

Thank you for your response to our application for funding under the Community Enhancement Program.

We would like to take a moment to explain the purpose of the application in hopes that there may be consideration to review it.

The Hamlet of Desbarats is a population of 106 homes and small businesses within the Township of Johnson. One of the oldest towns along the Northern Corridor, founded in 1889, The Hamlet serves an average annual population of approximately 1000 persons with 1 small Hardware/Grocery Store, 2 Restaurants, 1 Boat Sales and Service business and 1 Dock and Boat Launch. Summer can increase the number of residents to 1500. It is a small community with a Water & Sewer system that was installed in 1982.

Our reasoning for this application is under the 'What Projects are Eligible' section of the Enhance your Community Funding Stream are:

1. Incremental Improvements, repairs and or renovations to extend the useful life of capital assets including, "municipal assets".

The Lagoons are a municipal asset and cleaning and rehabilitating them is maintenance of that critically important asset. The lagoons are approximately 40 years old. The repairs and maintenance will ensure their continued use for many more years. The recent highwater in Lake Huron causing flooding of the area has damaged the access to these lagoons and as such the access does require repairs and maintenance.

1) The construction and/or 'renovation' of capital assets that <u>support community economic development</u> and that address an economic priority in a region.

The Hamlet of Desbarats is the ONLY commercial area on Hwy 17 between Bruce Mines, and Echo Bay, encompassing a total population of over 5,000 people not including summer residents.

In order for the Hamlet to be self-sustaining and to encourage community economic development, the lagoons must be repaired. As it stands at this time PUC that monitor our utilities (water and sewer) have reported the sewer system for the Hamlet is at capacity. There is no potential for Economic Growth.

For the Hamlet of Desbarats to be self-sufficient it must grow, there must be economic growth, if not we will forever be reliant on assistance to survive.

Recently we requested proposals to develop a Senior and low-income development on some municipal property in the center of our Hamlet. The development would have provided desperately needed senior housing and would have been an unprecedented boost to the sustainability and growth of the Hamlet of Desbarats.

Upon discovering that we have no capacity left in our sewer system unless we can rehabilitate the lagoons, we were forced to put the housing development on hold.

We are committed to grow Desbarats, increase property values, encourage economic growth and support those that wish to retire here and live and work from home here.

We are seeking assistance desperately needed, but we are willing to also contribute and make Desbarats solvent. The Hamlet is at a critical stage too small to sustain its own infrastructure and unable without assistance to have any economic growth.

By repairing and maintaining the lagoons the Township of Johnson meets the Evaluation Criteria of:

Aligning with the Organizational Plan for the Community
Supporting the sustainability of the Hamlet
Optimizing the 'capacity and efficiency of the Existing Infrastructure

We have looked back at past practices and we are moving hopefully in a new and better direction. We have taken steps to not be in this position again by establishing long overdue capital charges on water and sewer. We have also established 'fully funded' reserves to address future maintenance. Along with all the above we are applying for permission to construct at our own cost drying beds at our own landfill that will be capable of handling the sludge the next time in 40 years when the lagoons need cleaning again and not have to incur tipping fee and haulage charges.

We are committed and we are planning for the future, but today we have reached a crisis an emergency in every aspect that will, how it is dealt with have a very lasting impact on the Hamlet of Desbarats.

I appreciate your time in considering this request and that you will reconsider our application.
