- 1) We enjoyed an afternoon of water and bubbles at the CASS Elementary Splash day.
 - a. Mrs. Miller has been the organizer of this event for a number of years now and it proves to be one of the fun days for most of the students (and firefighters) as they enjoy some fun before beginning the summer break.
- 2) We are waiting for Dave Nadon regarding the installation of required electrical hardware for both the hall and the Gordon Lake Tower for backup power generators.
 - a. Quotes and reviews are being considered for the portable unit that will power the communications tower. an unit will be purchased shortly.
- 3) The summer season allows for testing on our portable pumps and this year we discovered that the largest volume fire pump was very difficult to prime and that it would not move water for us. The pump has been rebuilt and tested. The pump now moves water as it did when new. The impeller, exhaust priming valve and wear rings were no longer operating at peak efficiency. Once the parts were replaced the pump is back to full operating strength.
- 4) We are short manpower this month with people away on vacations, work and extra activities for many. It is worth noting that this is a common problem for departments in this area and we continue to work closely with our neighbouring departments to provide services when required.

By-Law 2024-1115

BEING A BY-LAW respecting Committee and Board Appointments for the Township of Johnson

WHEREAS the Council of the Township of Johnson deem it necessary to appoint person or persons to serve on Committees and Boards within the Township.

AND WHEREAS Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, permits a municipality to appoint such officers and servants as are necessary for the purpose of the Corporation;

AND FURTHER THAT this By-Law shall come into force and effect upon the final reading; and

THAT this By-Law shall repeal and replace any and all By-Laws previously passed for this purpose;

READ the first and final time this 17th day of July, 2024.

NOW THEREFORE THE Council of the Corporation of the Township of Johnson enacts as follows:

Take Root Desbarats to Echo Bay

As residents of Echo Bay we propose a revegetation project in our township of MacDonald, Meredith and Aberdeen Additional and the three adjacent townships of Tarbutt and Tarbutt Additional, Laird and Johnson (the Desbarats to Echo Bay Planning Board area). Tree canopy cover, and the environmental and aesthetic benefits it provides have been reduced in these townships due to recent and ongoing power line clearing maintenance by Algoma Power Inc.

The project will be executed through a partnership between Algoma Power Inc., Tree Canada (possible funding partner), Forests Ontario, the Desbarats to Echo Bay townships and us. The project will be facilitated through the Forests Ontario *Take Root* program and consist of a free distribution of trees, shrubs and native wildflower seeds to participating residents of the Desbarats to Echo Bay townships at an event held in Echo Bay in the spring of 2025.

Take Root is a Forests Ontario program that makes it easy for people to acquire low or no-cost native trees and/or shrubs for their homes, that leads to increased tree canopy cover through community engagement. Participants in the program are trained on the importance of a healthy tree canopy, how to choose the right tree/shrub, and proper planting and care techniques.

Algoma Power Inc. will:

- provide \$10,000 to Forests Ontario to successfully administer and implement the Take Root program
- promote the project and event through its various communication channels
- provide native wildflower seeds on the event day to distribute to all attendees
- if available, provide one staff person to assist in the distribution of trees, shrubs and wildflower seeds

Tree Canada (possible funding partner) will:

- provide \$10,000 to Forests Ontario to successfully administer and implement the Take Root program
- promote the project and event through its various communication channels
- if available, provide one staff person to assist in the distribution of trees, shrubs and wildflower seeds

Forests Ontario will:

- develop and maintain online registration (resident application and tree selection), planting records and survival tracking using the *Take Root* program
- provide 120 (30 trees/shrubs per township) high-quality sourced-identified native potted stock and coordinate the delivery of selected trees/shrubs on the event day
- liaise with the townships to determine the date, venue, and timing of the Echo Bay distribution event
- develop and provide educational resources and supplies for participants and the event (tree/shrub selection matrix, proper planting, post-planting maintenance and care, training slideshows, tree tags) to assist residents in selecting the right native tree/shrub for their specific planting location
- promote the project and event through its various communication channels
- if available, provide one staff person to assist in the distribution of trees, shrubs and wildflower seeds

Desbarats to Echo Bay townships and Hazletts will provide in-kind support to execute the project:

- provide residents with a distribution event in Echo Bay for all townships that meets the needs of their communities
- provide event coordination and management, and community engagement
- promote the project and event through community-tailored messaging using a variety of outreach methods
- determine the date, location, and timing of the event
- lead volunteer recruitment and coordination of the event
- secure event supplies and materials for event (i.e., tent, tables, chairs, distribution location etc.)
- coordinate planting assistance and/or delivery of trees/shrubs to residents with physical limitations who may not be able to attend the distribution event

Re: APH Fees for Review of Land Use Applications

We acknowledge receipt of your correspondence dated April 12, 2024 regarding Algoma Public Health's Sewage System Program 2024 and associated fee schedule. While the Planning Board is well aware of the financial challenges facing all public bodies, they are also questioning the justification for the fees proposed to be charged for review of land use planning applications such as consents to sever, minor variances and zoning by-law amendments.

The Ontario Building Code Act does authorize building permit fees to be charged for septic systems on a cost/recovery basis. This Planning Board however feels that the \$500 minimum fee, and additional fee of \$250/lot for applications of more than 2 lots, may be excessive and unreasonable, especially given that in the case of most land use planning applications no on site inspection is needed nor carried out. We also question whether there is even any authority under the Ontario Building Code Act to authorize the charging of fees to review and comment on land use planning applications.

Thank you for your consideration of this matter. We look forward to your response.

Re: Regulations for the Importation and Safe Use of Lithium-ion Batteries

I am writing today to bring to your attention a matter of significant importance to the Township of Otonabee-South Monaghan, regarding the importation and safe use of lithium-ion batteries.

At the June 17, 2024 Council Meeting the Fire Chief of the Township of Otonabee-South Monaghan made a presentation to Council on the dangers presented by lithium-ion batteries. The Fire Chief was reporting back from attending the Charged For Life Symposium presented by the Office of the Fire Marshal.

During the presentation, the Fire Chief stressed that the increased importation and use of non-Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) aftermarket batteries is presenting a significant increase in fire and explosion, putting citizens and responding personnel in danger. These after market batteries are not Underwriter Laboratories of Canada (ULC) certified but can be imported into Canada without any associated regulations.

Unlicensed persons and locations can store and modify lithium-ion batteries in our communities without regulations, providing dangerous conditions within a community. Charging these batteries within the home or multi-unit dwellings can result in larger fires with grave results.

As Canada becomes more aware of Green Energy solutions, these batteries are used more often, increasing the danger to our communities. We support the Ontario Fire Marshal's program to educate citizens on the danger associated with lithium-ion batteries and encourage every municipality to actively promote safe practices for the use of lithium-ion batteries.

We also call upon all levels of government to enact regulations for the importation, sale, storage, and use of non-OEM or ULC certified lithium-ion batteries.

Thank you in advance for your attention to this very critical issue, and I look forward to your prompt consideration and support.





Figure 1: Study Area Key Map with proposed Detour Route

Replacement of Three (3) Structures

Dear Sir/Madam,

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) – Northeast Region has retained Egis (formally McIntosh Perry Consulting Engineers Ltd.) to carry out the Detail Design and Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the rehabilitation/replacement of three (3) structures. The project works will include the replacement of one (1) bridge and one (1) culvert on Highway 17 as well as the replacement of one (1) bridge on Highway 548. A Key Map showing the study area is enclosed for your reference. A Notice of Study Commencement was distributed on November 17, 2023.

The proposed scope of work includes, but is not limited to:

- Rehabilitation of the Walker Creek Culvert (38S-00267/C0) located approx. 1.5 km west of Lake Huron Drive, Township of Johnson;
- Replacement of the Stobie Creek Bridge (38S-0180/B0) located approx. 2.6 km east of Lake Huron Drive, Township of Johnson; and
- Replacement of the Richardson Creek Bridge (38S-0212/B0) located approx. 300 m north of K Line Road, Township of Joseph.


This updated notice is being circulated to provide information on the revised detour route at Richardson Creek Bridge (see below). In order to complete the replacement of Richardson Creek Bridge, MTO is exploring options including a temporary highway closure. The proposed updated detour route will direct traffic from Highway 548 to A Line Road (refer to the attached key map). D Line Road and Highway 548 have been identified as viable east-west connecting routes. The road closure will allow for local traffic only.

The proposed detour route is approximately 14.6 km, which will add approx. 8 minutes of additional travel time. Advanced notice of the temporary full road closure with a signed detour route will be provided. Static road signs will be placed at strategic locations along the proposed detour route. The road closure would occur for approximately up to 16 weeks.

This study is following the approved environmental planning process for Group "C" projects under the *Class Environmental Assessment for Provincial Transportation Facilities*. The process includes gathering information on existing environmental conditions at the site; seeking input from stakeholders, external agencies, Indigenous communities, and the public; an assessment of potential impacts of the proposed works; and the identification of measures required to mitigate any adverse effects. The environmental assessment study will be documented in an Environmental Screening Document.




Figure 1: Study Area Key Map with proposed Detour Route
